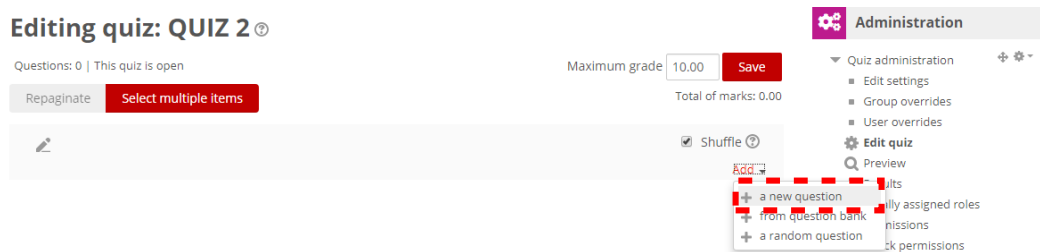


## HOW TO GIVE SHORT ANSWER EXPLANATIONS FOR MULTIPLE CHOICE QUESTIONS

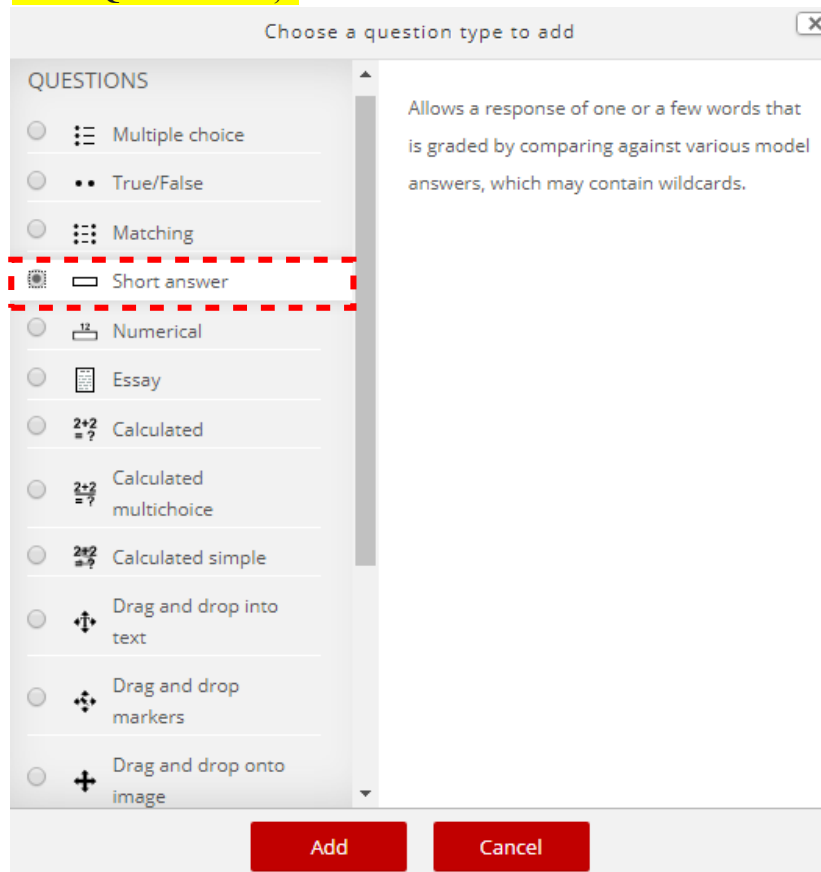
Dear Teachers,

This can be found under the “**Editing Exam**” option.



By clicking on “**New Question tab;**”

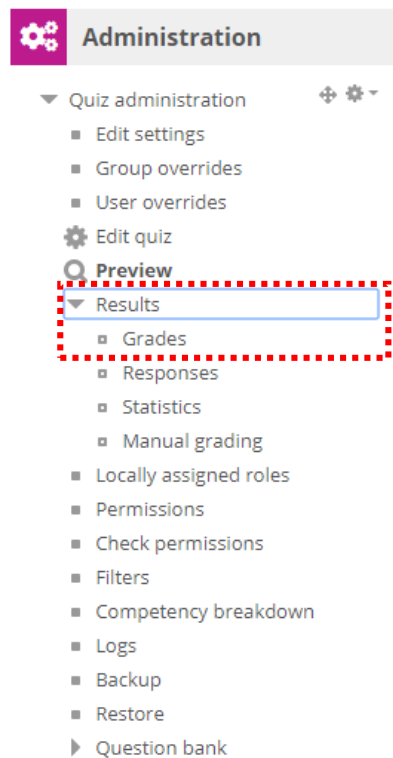
